



Skol Nansledan Plan for making best use of the Catch-up Premium

Following the enforced interruption to schools earlier this year, due to the Covid 19 pandemic, the Government pledged extra funding to help children catch up where they may have fallen behind. Below is an overview of how we will be using this funding.

Teaching

Subject knowledge is key to successful teaching so we are providing CPD in Phonics and maths to support both diagnostic assessment and effective teaching. Staff training in Read Write Inc phonics and the NCETM's Professional Development Spines for maths.



Academic Recovery

We are employing staff to deliver targeted support to identified pupils and groups of pupils who have fallen behind. These interventions include Catch-Up Phonics (Read Write Inc & Fresh Start); Maths Ready to Progress groups; Ready for Secondary Y6 group tuition.

Emotional Recovery

The act of recovery is at least as much an emotional and social one as it is academic, and at the heart of our learners' eventual success. We are delivering weekly wellbeing activities including our SCARF programme and outdoor learning. All of our new staff have received TIS training.
