We want to share with you our class structure plans for the new school year as we enter our third year of growth. We will be adding an additional KS1 class and an additional KS2 class, establishing the following 10-class structure:

- 2 Reception Classes
- 2 Year 1 Classes
- 2 Year 2 Classes
- 1 Year 3 Class
- 2 mixed Y4/5 Classes
- 1 Year 6 class.

We are in the process of recruiting more staff to join the team so have not yet assigned teachers or pupils to individual classes but will update you all in due course.
